UPDATES

- Falls Prevention Press Release to go out 9/12/2024. Falls are the leading cause of fatal and nonfatal injuries among seniors age 65 and older in Missouri. DHSS is partnering with the National Council on Aging to host a series of events to raise awareness about tips to reduce falls. The press release will be posted at https://health.mo.gov/news
- **RSV Education**: Dr. Miller will be sending out a letter to providers in Missouri on RSV and the DHSS Office of Public Information will send out a press release in coordination with that letter either this week or next week. Resources for LPHAs will be added to the Hub, as well.
- **ELC-LPHA Contracts update** from Tiffany Bayer, CLPHS: To ensure that DHSS and our LPHAs, as subrecipients of the CDC-ELC Grant, are in compliance with the use of funds in accordance with the CDC ELC Cooperative Agreement, changes are needed to the current processes regarding prior approvals and invoicing. These changes will be outlined within a contract amendment that will be issued in the near future and additional information will be sent at a later date regarding this amendment. Some changes are effective immediately regarding prior approvals and submitting invoices for payment. All prior approval requests will now need to be submitted by completing an online form through the ELC Hub located here. If you have submitted a request and have not received an approval/denial as of today's date, you will need to utilize the hub to resubmit that request. Changes regarding invoice submissions will also be effective immediately and instructions as to what is needed to accompany each invoice sent for payment is included as an attachment to this email. If you submitted a previous invoice that needs additional information in order to be processed, you will be receiving email correspondence from CLPHS asking that you add the additional information and resubmit. Our operations and requirements must evolve as the pandemic response evolves, and with the evolvement must come increased rigidity to protect not only DHSS, but our local public health partners. It is just as important to work together now as it was in the beginning of the pandemic to ensure that we meet the needs of Missourians, while also ensuring that the funding spent meets contract deliverables and that expenditures are allowable, allocable, reasonable, and necessary. Thank you for joining us to work as a team through these changes. In order to provide the best guidance possible, we will be hosting several technical sessions. The dates of those sessions will be released soon via email and LPHA Hub. (Attachment)
- Fluoride Varnish: The Office of Dental Health hosts a quarterly meeting with LPHAs to discuss opportunities to begin a fluoride varnish program at the health department and WIC clinic. This meeting provides details on how to get this started and allows for the sharing of ideas and information between LPHAs. Meetings will begin in October 2024.

- Unregulated psychoactive cannabis products: DHSS is withdrawing the *Memo for Missouri Food Retails and Wholesalers Executive Order 24-10 Implementation,* issued August 29, 2024, which was included in the August 29 weekly communications bulletin. The Department will continue to embargo food containing unregulated psychoactive cannabis products, as directed by Executive Order 24-10. A press conference was held Tuesday, Sept 10th by the Governor regarding enforcement, mostly related to enforcement efforts by the Attorney General's Office and the Division of Alcohol & Tobacco Control.
- New laws from the 2024 legislative session took effect on August 28, unless otherwise noted.
 The list below is courtesy of Missouri Foundation for Health. The online <u>Missouri Revisor of</u>
 Statutes is updated to reflect the new laws. They include, but are not limited to:
 - Federal Reimbursement Allowance Extends the expiration dates for the federal reimbursement allowance, a funding mechanism for the Medicaid program, for hospitals, nursing facilities, and other providers from September 30, 2024, to September 30, 2029.
 - 340B Drug Program Enacts provisions that prohibit restriction of contracted pharmacies to participate in the 340B program (<u>376.414 RSMo</u>).
 - Blair's Law Establishes "Blair's Law" which criminalizes celebratory gun fire (571.031RSMo).
 - Unlawful possession of a firearm Increases the penalty for unlawful possession of a firearm (571.070 RSMo).
 - Senior Property Tax Credit Clarifies issues from the 2023 law which allows a freeze on property tax for individuals who qualify as a senior (137.1050 RSMo).
 - Land Banks Expands the locations where land banks may be established. (<u>Sections</u> 140.982-140.987 RSMo).
 - Eviction Moratoriums Provides that no county, municipality, or political subdivision shall impose or enforce a moratorium on eviction proceedings unless authorized by state law (67.137 RSMo, not yet available online).
 - Recovery High Schools Changes the deadline for a school district to submit a proposal
 to operate a recovery high school from December 1st to July 1st of the school year
 preceding the beginning of operation of the school (167.850 RSMo).
 - Missouri Rural Access to Capital Act Provides a tax credit for certain investments made for businesses located in rural areas (<u>Sections 620.3500 – 620.3530 RSMo</u>).
 - Medicaid Funding for Planned Parenthood Prohibits MO HealthNet funding of abortion facilities and affiliates (this legislation specifically targets Planned Parenthood clinics). (188.015 RSMo, 188.220 RSMo, 208.152 RSMo, 208.153 RSMo, 208.164 RSMo, and 208.659 RSMo).
 - Child Care Prohibits establishing or operating a pediatric extended care facility without a license issued by the Department of Health and Senior Services, effective August 28, 2025. (210.201 RSMo, 210.211 RSMo, 210.252 RSMo, and 210.275 RSMo).
 - Veteran Suicide Prevention Requires the Missouri Veterans' Commission, in collaboration with the Department of Mental Health, to provide recommendations and make efforts to prevent veteran suicide and file a report with the Department of Public Safety and the General Assembly before July 1, 2025 and by every subsequent July 1st (42.022 RSMo).

Eagle Produce LLC Scottsdale, AZ is **voluntarily recalling whole cantaloupe** potentially contaminated with *Salmonella*. The products were distributed between August 13th - 17th in Missouri and other states in various retail supermarkets.
