## **COVID vaccine update** from DHSS Bureau of Immunizations:

FDA Announces Approval and Authorization of Updated COVID-19 Vaccines
On August 22, 2024, the <u>U.S Food and Drug Administration took action approving and authorizing for emergency use updated mRNA COVID-19 vaccines</u> formulated to target currently circulating variants and to provide better protection against serious consequences of COVID-19, including hospitalization and death. These actions relate to updated mRNA vaccines for 2024—2025 manufactured by ModernaTX Inc. and Pfizer Inc., which have been updated to include a monovalent (single) component that corresponds to the Omicron variant KP.2 strain.

Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine (2024–2025 Formula): people 6 months and older

Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine (2024–2025 Formula): people 6 months and older

The 2023–2024 Novavax COVID-19 vaccine remains authorized but is no longer available in the United States, as all doses have expired. Accordingly, at this time, <u>CDC recommendations for use of Novavax COVID-19 vaccine have been removed</u>. CDC recommendations will be updated if FDA approves or authorizes additional 2024–2025 COVID-19 vaccines.

#### 2023-2024 mRNA COVID-19 Vaccines Are No Longer Authorized

As part of FDA's actions, the 2023–2024 Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines are no longer authorized for use in the United States. To minimize the risk of <u>vaccine administration</u> errors, providers should:

- Remove all 2023–2024 mRNA COVID-19 vaccines from storage units immediately, even if they are not expired.
- Once all inventory is fully accounted for, delete 2023–2024 mRNA COVID-19 vaccine listings from the available vaccine inventory in your Immunization Information System, as applicable.
- Return all unused 2023–2024 mRNA COVID-19 vaccines to CDC's centralized distributor using the normal process for returning spoiled/expired vaccines.

**Meningococcal B vaccine update**: On August 19, 2024, the FDA approved an updated package insert for the Bexsero Meningococcal B vaccine that included a change to the vaccine schedule. ACIP will review the new scheduling guidelines during their October 2024 meeting. In the interim, providers should refer to the updated Bexsero package insert for the current FDA-approved schedule as summarized below:

- Two doses given six months apart, or
- Three doses given at 0, 1-2, and 6-month intervals
